1 2019-20 S4 elective subjects arrangements

1.1 Core subjects and elective subjects preliminary arrangements

Our school has already conducted the senior secondary subject opinion survey with S3 students in the second term according to their results in S2. After analyzing students' wishes, students' performance and teachers' opinions, the number of enrolments in each subject and group, the subjects that are offered in the coming school term are as follows:

- 1.1.1 There will be not more than 14 elective groups in S4 in the 2019-20 academic year. Each elective group consists of around 22 students. (Note 1)
- 1.1.2 There will be 2 English and 3 Chinese classes for Maths.
- 1.1.3 In order to help students to bridge their junior and senior secondary studies smoothly, S3 subjects (Math, I.S., Geog, Hist and Comp. Literacy) that are conducted in English will have their learning fine-tuned with Chinese.
- 1.1.4 After collecting opinions from parents from the 'Senior Subjects Opinions Survey' and teachers' review, the arrangements are now as follows:
