The Birth of Islam

Islam was founded by ______ in the 7th century AD. Mohammed was an Arab born in Mecca in present-day Saudi Arabia. According to the *Koran*, in AD 610, Angel ______ asked Mohammed to preach that ______ was the only god. Later, Mohammed started to preach the

words of Allah in Mecca. He was regarded as the messenger and prophet of Allah.

- Islam is an Arabic word, meaning 'submitting to Allah'. Its followers are called
 '_____', meaning 'those submitting to Allah'.
- Islam harmed the interests of priests, nobles and merchants in Mecca. They joined together and tried to kill Mohammed. In AD 622, Mohammed and his followers fled from Mecca to Yathrib. This flight was known as the ______.
 Mohammed set up his base in Yathrib and renamed it ______, meaning the 'City of the Prophet'.
- In AD 630, Mohammed led an army and captured Mecca. He then removed all idols from the ______. As ______ was the birthplace of Mohammed, Muslims call it the '______ city'. It became the centre of Islam.
- Islamic teachings state that Muslims must worship only Allah and believe in the words of the holy book, the ______. Muslims also have to follow the Five Pillars of Islam

Development of Islam

Under the leadership of Mohammed, Islam spread throughout Arabia. After Mohammed's death, his followers conquered many places in the ______
 East and spread Islam there. By the 7th and the 8th century AD, Islam had spread to Central Asia, northern India, Southern Europe and Northern Africa. By the 13th century AD, Islam had spread from India to Southeast Asia. It also spread to many European countries when the Ottoman Empire expanded westwards.

- However, most of Mohammed's followers opposed Ali and stated the successor should be elected according to tradition. This group was called the 'Sunni', which means '_____'.
- Islam is thus divided into Sunni Islam and Shia Islam. Today, Sunni Islam is the largest branch of Islam. About 90 % Muslims are Sunnis.
