1 **Distribution of the S3 Second Term Report Card**

Class teachers will distribute the second term report cards to S3 students on 16th June (Thu). 2 **Class Arrangements during the S3 Second Term Examination**

The S3 second term examination will be held from 20th to 30th June, 2022, during which time class arrangements will be altered. S1, S2, S4 and S5 students please refer to Attachment 1 for details. Should you have any enquiries, please contact Mr. Ko, the Vice Dean of Studies.

3 **S1 to S2, S4 to S5 Second Term Examination Arrangements**

The Second Term Exam will take place from 13th to 26th June (S1 to S2) and from 11th to 26th June (S4 to S5). Details of the arrangements are shown in Attachment 2 to 4. Please encourage your child to be well-prepared in order to achieve their best results. Furthermore, please pay attention to the following items:

- 3.1 Students are required to tap their student ID cards before 8 a.m., otherwise they will be considered late.
- 3.2 Students must go directly to the examination rooms for quiet revision once they arrive at school. They must keep silent while waiting for the examination to commence.
- 3.3 In the event that any student has forgotten to bring their student ID card, that student needs to bring his/her student handbook to Room 207 to verify his/her identity. Under these circumstances, the exam WILL NOT be delayed and the student will not be given extra time for the exam.
- 3.4 Regarding absence or lateness without reason; 0 marks may be given for that subject.
- 3.5 Before the commencement of an examination, you are reminded to take out the battery from your mobile phones (if possible) to ensure that no sound will be emitted. The alarm function of the mobile phone or any similar device (including electronic watches) should be switched off. You may be subject to a penalty according to the school regulations if your mobile phone or the alarm rings during an examination.
- 3.6 If a child cannot attend an exam because of illness or any special reasons, the parent must apply for leave to the School by phone call on that morning. Only after your child carries out the leave application procedures upon his/her return to school (and presentation of a medical certificate for sick leave to Mr. Ko, the Vice Dean of Studies, at Room 301), will special arrangements for the exam be considered.
- 3.7 Special arrangements for absence will be considered only if the student approaches Mr. Ko at Room 301 by 30th June.
- 3.8 If the Education Bureau announces suspension of classes because of adverse weather conditions, all the exams scheduled for that day will be rearranged. Please visit the School website: <http://www.lss.edu.hk/> for detailed information of arrangements.
- 3.9 If a student is absent from the lessons of a particular subject for over one-eighth of the total lessons (including sick leave and casual leave) in each term, s/he will not be permitted to attend the exam and 0 marks will be given for that subject (except for students who receive exemption approval from the Principal in advance).
- 3.10 Please refer to P.15-16 of the student handbook for other exam regulations.

3.11 Promotion requirements

3.11.1 S1 to S2 students will not be allowed to be promoted to the next form level if they cannot achieve a pass in the overall results of Chinese, English and Maths; or their conduct has been determined to be unsatisfactory.

3.11.2 S4 to S5 students will not be allowed to be promoted to the next form level if they cannot achieve a pass in the overall results of Chinese, English, Maths, Citizenship and Social Development, and Liberal Studies; or their conduct has been determined to be unsatisfactory.

4 **Arrangements of the 2022/23 S4 Subject Selection Process (Applicable to S3)**

To provide a diversified learning programme for the 2022/23 school year, the school has summarised the results of the recent mock subject selection. In considering the students' learning needs and further academic development, the School has adopted the following arrangements for the S4 subject selection. Details are as follows:

4.1 Elective Subjects

The School will offer 3 course categories, including 20 groups of elective subjects:

Remarks:

- 4.1.1 Students who have studied Applied Psychology and Physical Education previously will be given priority when selecting these subjects.
- 4.1.2 #In addition to the above elective subjects of Category A and Category B, students can also apply for subjects of Category C (French, German, Japanese, Spanish, Korean).
- 4.1.3 The above courses of Category C are provided by external institutions. These classes will be arranged on Saturday mornings or afternoons. The tuition fee will be paid by the Education Bureau. Students will pay for textbooks and teaching materials (approx. HK\$500).
- 4.1.4 Students who are interested in selecting subjects of Category C are required to complete the reply slip. The School will arrange an internal interview(s). Students with relevant learning experience will be given priority. Those who pass the interview will be notified of class arrangements.

4.2 Medium of Instruction

- 4.2.1 Mathematics will offer two EMI groups and two CMI groups.
- 4.2.2 This year, to help students prepare for senior high school, certain S3 EMI classes (i.e., Mathematics, Integrated Science, Geography, History and Computer) will now be conducted in CMI format. This will take place in selected individual subjects.


4.5 Arrangements of S4 Subject Selection for S3 Students
